HELP WORKERS AT McDONALD'S GET A FAIR DEAL AT WORK

Last year, workers at McDonald's took strike action for the first time in history.

People working at McDonald's endure low pay, zero-hours contracts and problems with bullying and harassment by poorly trained and low-paid managers.

McDonald's employs over 115,000 workers in around 12,000 restaurants, with a turnover of £17bn a year. Its chief executive picks up nearly £12m a year, while those on the shop floor earn just above the legal minimum. Workers often don't even know how many hours they'll be working from week-to-week.

These problems persist because the company won't allow McDonald's workers a trade union voice at work. Trade unions represent people at work, raising concerns and working with employers to tackle problems



like the ones that are common at McDonald's.

We are calling on McDonald's to recognise the Bakers Food and Allied Workers Union so that all workers can enjoy a fair deal at work and we need your help.
