There has been much to celebrate over the year, including the May Day rally in Berlin, but also getting first-hand a sense of the huge breadth of activity undertaken by the TUC. This has reinforced Leslie's conviction that we live in a time that, despite everything, is an opportunity for unions to grow and to organise. He'd like to see unions – and union leadership – becoming more

diverse and he thinks that will happen if unions can develop and nurture a new generation of activists.

There's no doubt that it's been a rollercoaster year and of course at the start of his presidency Leslie had hoped that May 2015 would bring in a very different political landscape. But he returns, time and again, to the values that brought him to trade unionism in the first place. As he

contemplates retirement, with more time to enjoy tennis, play bridge and listen to music, Leslie will be passing the baton on, he hopes, to a whole new generation of trade unionists. "We have to campaign," he says. "We have to have a clear message of hope." ●
