#Oct18 "Britain Needs a Payrise" Demo

The TUC Young Workers forum recognise that young workers are one of the groups worst affected by low pay. With the national apprenticeship rate at just £2.68 an hour and insecure work contracts like zero-hours, as well as the burden of student debt it's no wonder young people are struggling.

The forum knows how important it is that young workers join the March on Oct 18th to ensure they have a central presence in this vital campaign. That's why they've produced a new video: <u>'Why Young Workers are Marching"</u>.



TUC Young Workers Organising Strategy

The TUC Young Workers Forum is pleased to announce that the Motion to TUC Congress 2014 on Organising Young Workers, was passed unanimously. The forum met on Saturday 4th October to discuss plans for taking this action forward. Based on the discussions the Chair and Vice Chair will be writing up a draft proposal and sending this out to unions for further consultation before meeting with TUC senior staff as part of the consultation process.



Traineeships


Delegates to the forum have raised concerns regarding the statement from CBI and TUC concerning traineeships. The Forum discussed the issue at their recent meeting and the following action plan has been agreed:

The YWF Chair and Vice Chair will write a statement summarising the concerns raised. The final position of the Forum will then be raised at the next General Council meeting.



TUC Housing Survey

We have had an overwhelming response to our Housing Survey, so far 2,305 young people have replied, showing that Housing remains a priority issue for young people. Thanks to all who distributed and responded! We will keep you updated on the results.
