The number of 16- to 20-year-olds not being paid the minimum wage has gone up by 52 per cent since 2010.

Half of all zero-hours workers are under 30.

Young people are often expected to work for free on internships and work experience.

BUT TRADE UNIONS CAN HELP...

They bargain with employers to get young workers paid above the minimum.

» If you are a union member under 25, on average you will earn 38 per cent more than your friends who are not members. «
