

Tolpuddle Martyrs and the lessons today

The story of the six farm workers, transported into slavery for forming a union in 1834 and freed after a massive outcry, is one of the most significant episodes in the early days of trade unionism. The successful campaign to free the men and support their families was led by the London to Dorchester Committee; it confirmed the right of workers to organise.
