




NHS funding since 2010


Figure 1: Health spending in England – projections for this Parliament (in 2017/18 prices)

Figure 2: Health spending per person in England: projections for this Parliament






NHS funding – compared with other EU countries




Hospital bed supply

Nurse staffing levels


Number of nurses per 1,000 people, 2014 or nearest year



Gap between the adult social care budget and funding pressures












Performance deteriorating – A&E waiting times






Performance deteriorating – waiting lists






Performance deteriorating – cancer treatment






Performance deteriorating – delayed transfers









STPs: addressing the three 'gaps'


- The health and wellbeing gap the pressing need to reduce demand on the NHS by shifting the focus towards prevention and addressing health inequalities
- The care and quality gap to harness technology and innovation to reduce variations in the quality, safety and outcomes in care
- 3. The funding and efficiency gap to ensure that additional funding for the NHS is used to improve efficiencies, transform services and achieve financial sustainability

NHS spending on independent sector providers as a proportion of total NHS revenue spending




