Public spending cuts are not the way to tackle the deficit

Since the election the Con Dem government has already cut public spending by £6.2 billion:

- £50 million has been extracted from the North East
- Nine of the region's local authorities were in the higher bracket for cuts – with just one in London.
- The rebuilding of 46 NE schools was halted
- Subsidised meals programmes predominantly for pensioners and the disabled have been stopped in some areas
- And there are also plans to privatise Royal Mail

This is only the tip of the iceberg as the Comprehensive Spending Review will deliver the bulk of the massive £80 billion devastating public spending cuts which will affect the North East disproportionately.

- If the cuts go ahead on this scale it will be the biggest reduction in spending since the Second World War.
- Unemployment in the North East currently stands at 9.1% the highest in the country and with 1 in 3 jobs in our region in the public sector this figure is set to

sky-rocket as the impending cuts are translated into job losses.

- Many private sector jobs also depend on public spending
- Public sector workers spend 70p of every £1 in the local economy. The effects will be catastrophic.

The government are presenting the deficit as a legacy of the previous government (as opposed to a global financial crisis) and offering savage and swift public spending cuts as the only way we can reduce the deficit. Neither is true. There is an alternative:

- A fairer tax system would bring in £125 billion in unpaid taxes
- Make the banks pay for the financial crisis they caused: a Financial Transactions (Robin Hood) tax would raise a further £20 billion from the banking sector
- Job creation would mean more people in work to pay their taxes and spend money in the economy.
