## Update from Project Workers Forum

Project Workers in attendance included Unity, Communitas, Usdaw, BFAWU, RCM, Unison and URTU.

### Unionlearn update:

New unionlearn Midlands regional structure in place with Lisa Stones and Mick Brightman as Senior Union Support Officers, the role now includes ULF Projects support. New Learning Campaign Support Officer's role introduced to the region with main focus on promoting union learning.

## TU Ed update:

Derby College will not be offering trade union educational courses from September 2015. Two full time members of staff will be redundant from the end of May, with the co-ordinator covering the courses until the end of July.

### Stoke-on-Trent College

After forty years of trade union education, Stoke College have served notice that they intend to close the TU Ed unit and are currently in consultation according to their legal obligations. The TUC, along with the co-ordinator, are currently looking at ways to save the unit and maintain the TUC education at Stoke-on-Trent College. However, if this fails, discussions are taking place for another provider to take over the provision. This would mean that TUC education would still be delivered in Stoke area, hopefully by the same people but in a different



venue. Further meetings are arranged between the principal of the College, the TUC REO and the TUC National Education Officer.

## Solihull College

Notice was given from the college in late April with the intention of closing the Trade Union Education Unit on the 1<sup>st</sup> August, 2015.

The latest two closures are directly linked to the 17-25% cut in the adult skills budget that was announced at the end of February. In fact both Stoke and Solihull colleges claim because of the structures the cut is closer to 32% of their adult skills budget.

Further changes of funding come into force from August 2015 and affect ULR training, the Level 2 awards and Level 3 diplomas will no longer exist. Colleges will be looking to join Part 1 and Part 2 to enable the ULR to achieve a new Level 2 certificate. This means that the ULRs will be required to commit to and attend both five day courses which would be spread over the academic year.

### Stress busting session

Lisa Stones and Mick Brightman delivered the session and explained how unionlearn could either support the Project Workers with delivery or to train ULRs to deliver it going forward.

### **ULR Training and Development**

There were concerns raised about the difficulties filling ULR courses, potentially compounded by the new funding restrictions, unions then shared their own union's approach to courses, where they are delivered and if other unions could potentially attend.

Unionlearn reassured the forum that we remain committed to offering support to ULRs and will continue with the ULR Forums in the region, PWs emphasised the need for a training element to be included in the forums to give a greater chance of release for ULRs and help ULR development. It was agreed to change the invitation and agenda to clearly demonstrate the training / development aspect. Also it was

agreed that stress busting and social media training would be in the next round of forums, the dates for which are:
